Your total support in amount of \$468, I received from Final Frontiers Foundation. It was so helpful to my work fund in the ministry among the hill tribes of Akha and Lahu as well as to new work among the Palong tribe. I also counted as the Lord's answer to my monthly prayers for the needs of the work and I will try to budget to the most needy first from what the Lord provided and if it is not enough, I just asked them to pray and await the next blessing. This is how the money will be spent 1) to help the evangelists who got a small amount from sponsor and for traveling to villages which is very expensive to travel on the bad roads. 2) Help to develop the system of water from the mountains by buying water pipes for them. 3) Help buy food for the children at the hostel. Please pray for more TEAM funds as I still need funds for the growing ministry. Many new churches have been established among the Akha and Lahu and that means we make more trips to go and follow up the work and right now I have 23 who are with me for training every two months. 

A Tribute to Jimmy

About a year ago I received word that a preacher friend in Thailand had passed away. His name was Jimmy Tachinam. This of course was only his adopted name, as he was from a tribal group called the Rawang, who live in northern Burma. Many times, Jimmy told me that you could stand on the porch of his house there and look out on the horizon and see China and Tibet. Jimmy, like most of the first preachers we supported,

were from the same tribe. They had all left their homeland which was more than 80% Christian to travel to the regions of China and Southeast Asia. They shared with the heathen tribes there, what American missionaries had brought to their people decades earlier, the Truth about the true and living God and the sacrifice of His Son.

I met Jimmy thirteen years ago this month and without a doubt, we at Final Frontiers owe a lot to him. He introduced us to so many preachers that we now support. He helped us to establish our payment policies and practices. He helped develop our accountability system, and he showed me personally that the best, and at times the only way, to reach the unreached tribes was by supporting another tribal preacher to go where I (or another American missionary) could not go. He was right.

Our file on Jimmy is perhaps our thickest of the fifteen hundred that we have. He was an excellent communicator, though his English was a bit broken. He spoke twelve languages fluently and worked tirelessly in translating the Scripture into various languages and translating American and tribal hymnals as well.

I will never forget my first venture with him evangelizing among the Akha and Lahu tribes. Six months

later, I returned with my father and older brother Ben. When we arrived in the village that previously did not know Jesus, they lined both sides of the trail and began to sing with incredible harmony as Jimmy had taught them. The songs were unfamiliar to me. Jimmy stood beside us and translated the hymns these new converts had composed. I remember one song so well, that even today, the tune runs through my mind. "We praise you Creator. You make our rice grow and send rain to the fields. You keep the rats away from our banana trees. You make our jungle trails straight..." Jimmy, by the way, was given a nickname by the tribes. He was called "songbird" because he taught them how to sing and harmonize.

Jimmy had not just taught them who Christ is, he had lived among them as God's epistle, and their lives had been changed. On that same trip, Jimmy took us to a little house on stilts where I had first encountered the national preacher earlier that year. The family had moved out and given their house for young men to live in who had come from other villages to study for the ministry. That's right, Jimmy had started a Bible School, with no outside help. Some forty young men were training, who in the following three years

would start more than eighty churches in Thailand, Burma, Laos, and China. All without outside assistance or support. It is amazing for me to look back in those records and see how many of those "young men" are now "veteran preachers" who have duplicated this method throughout the region. Most of these have stayed true to their calling and receive some support from Final Frontiers.

Jimmy also helped me to learn so much about working cross-culturally. He taught me how to drop the baggage of regional and national differences and allow the new "church" to grow according to their own culture. The importance of this lesson cannot be understated. We

may all be a part of the Bride of Christ, but few would venture to believe that we are all exactly alike. Practices that are normal in one culture are foreign in another. For instance, in relatively few countries in the world do we find the men and women sitting on the same side of the auditorium. Usually, the men are on one side and ladies are on the other. Neither method is right or wrong, they are expressions of the established culture in which that "church" is growing. Jimmy was always careful to not force his Rawang methods on the other tribes. He was also mixing the Rawang missionaries with the "national" tribal preachers. They worked in groups and one was not superior to the other.

There are other lessons that we learned from him. One of our strictest policies is a "one strike you're out" policy. By that we mean this. Any preacher we support can recommend another preacher for support. However, if it is found out that the applicant does not meet our standards in doctrine, experience or lifestyle, not only will he not be supported, but the one recommending him can never recom-

mend another preacher. This may seem harsh, but in this way, we have a firm "first line" of accountability. All these men want their friends to be supported, but this policy keeps them from trying to "pass through" one less deserving out of friendship or family ties, at the expense of never being able to help another one. The policy works well, unfortunately, it had to be applied to Jimmy as well. You see, Jimmy was responsible

for probably thirty of the first forty referrals we ever had. His choices were excellent men who had proven themselves over the years. One day however, he brought a preacher to me from his own tribe whom he had know for years (though he had not seen him for many years). As Jimmy left, I talked




Jimmy is seen here teaching the Gospel to the head of a village and other non-believers.

with this man and learned that he had changed his doctrine drastically in regard to baptismal regeneration and eternal security. Frankly, we could not support him. I had to share that with Jimmy and restrict him from referring others. He understood and complied. There was no loss of friendship or common service and it served as an example to others.

Latter, a group of Hmong refugees living in California and Minnesota that Jimmy had won to Christ in their homeland, offered to bring him to the USA to preach to them for several months. Jimmy stayed at least three years. During that time, we had to adopt a policy on supporting nationals who come to the States for any reason. Our conclusion, upon counseling with our national leaders, was that if a preacher was awarded a scholarship to study here or in another region, we would request the sponsor to continue

support for up to one year. If he stayed longer, his support would be dropped. This happened to Jimmy, yet in the time he was here, he started two new churches among his former converts and the others from South East Asia living in our country. He stayed true to his call no matter what continent he was on, but frankly, the converts here were able to support him. After a few years, Jimmy went back to Asia and continued his work, no longer needing assistance from Final Frontiers. Finally, last October, Jimmy went on to be with the Lord.

It may be thought at first that Jimmy started our well and faltered in the end. Not so. He broke no laws,

no rules, only policies, and only one at that. His contribution to our ministry, and those that have spun off from us and continue to do so, were invaluable. He was a Godsend.

Jimmy Tachinam was a fearless servant of God, and equally tireless. I watched him on numerous occasions, as the rest of us would stretch out on a bamboo floor to sleep, he would take a candle or lantern and sit on a tree stump and go to work translating an application or a report form for another preacher's sponsor. The men that he referred to as golden, some have gone on to take positions as regional and tribal coordinators. They have all trained more men for the ministry and have their own sons in the faith being sponsored.

Jimmy started three Bible Schools that I know of. he translated the Bible or portions of it into a dozen languages.

He raised funds and printed songbooks books and Bibles at his own expense. he trained more men for the ministry than any preacher I have ever known and probably started more than 500 churches in his life. Heaven's gain is our loss. It was a privilege to support him, to work with him and to know him as a friend.

We have never featured a story like this before in our *Progress Report*, but I just wanted you to know the quality and caliber of preacher that we work with.

They may not all be as gifted as he, but they all share the same burden of taking the Gospel to those who have never heard it before, to cross the Final Frontiers of this planet no matter what the risk, for the prize of presenting to their King, another soul brought from the darkness to His marvelous light. ■

I was attending a Baptist youth camp when I heard a sermon preached on salvation. I was convicted and felt sorrow for my sins. I was saved in 1984. I did not know much about Jesus Christ though I heard his name being mentioned by preachers in different ways. My former life was a sinful life. I can remember one day I was feeding my cattle and I saw a pastor and two church elders coming towards me. These men of God started to teach me about Jesus. In my heart by that time I was planning to rebuke them, but God's Words became stronger and stronger until at last I decided to receive Jesus as my personal Savior. In 1990, I heard a call of God, Isaiah 6:8, Matthew 28: 18-19. I was admitted to Eldoret Baptist Bible Institute in 1991, and I graduated in 1994.

My wife Grace, was saved in 1984. Before she was saved she was a housewife. Since then she is always busy in our house and ladies meetings in different areas. She has a good testimony in the church and surrounding community.

I work with other preachers reaching different tribal peoples for Christ. I have led 120 people to Christ and baptized 100. I speak Kiswahili and Kalenjin and I work with the Kikuyu, Luhya, Kalenfin and the Turkana. We are working to start new churches in the near future but for now we cannot start churches because of all the tribal clashes. It is difficult to do a lot of evangelism in the area now because of the government regulations.

We grow some of our food and we live in a three room house made of mud and thatched with iron sheets. To earn a living for my family, I work as a farmer. Your financial help will provide for our family and help us in our ministry. Please pray for our country that many will come to Christ through the conflicts we are having here.


I was very young when my parents trusted in Christ. Being trained in the Bible made it easier for me to trust in the Lord. When I was eighteen, I was baptized and left to serve in the South Vietnamese Army. Twice I was nearly killed, so I knew the Lord must have a purpose for sparing my life. When our land was overtaken, I began to study with various pastors. Each would train me in a different subject or book of the Bible. I determined to do whatever God wanted. Since that time, I have served in evangelism. We usually have at least three saved each week.

My wife sews to earn money for our family. Some days she must work even twelve hours so I help her. The rest of our time is spent witnessing and in studying the Bible, so that we can teach to others what we have learned.

We live in a two room house made of light wood. We eat simple food, mostly rice. Our desire is to serve the Lord always, even though we are poor. Your help and prayers are needed, but please don't reveal us to others. It is illegal to preach in Vietnam and in recent days the persecution of Christians has increased.

Beginning from January 1999, we worked as teams in follow-up work. Like the apostle Paul's second missionary journey, we confirmed the believers and many were added to the Church. Within this year 1999, we are thinking that instead of entering new villages we would make follow up trips and confirm the churches we have founded. We are using Paul's method. This is very important because the churches may have their own issues, arguments on some minor points and in order to be established in the faith, Bible study and the teaching of Christian life is important. We did very well by the grace of the Lord. We also taught the nature of being a local self-supporting church. Giving a handful of grains (rice) to the church every Sunday is a good start. In that way, from the sale of many handfuls of rice becomes a good income for the church. Please pray that the Holy Spirit may guide and inspire our churches. Thank you very much.
