Using smuggler's trails to take Bibles into Iran

Believers from the United States, Syria and Iran coordinate an historical delivery of New Testaments into Iran



Recently, the Final Frontiers Society, which is the Bible distribution branch of our foundation, participated in purchasing 12,000 New Testaments in the Farsi Language for shipment to Iran. These could not be trucked or flown in. UPS and FedEx could not make the delivery. These copies of God's Word were transported by Believers in Syria who traveled through Iraq to the border of Iran, where they were smuggled in by Believers who literally risked beheading to accomplish this task. Here is their story.

I want to thank every one of you who participated in getting the New Testaments to Iran. On behalf of the brothers living in northern Iran and those in Tehran, the capital, I send greetings from hearts filled with gratitude.

Today in the north there are at least five house churches in Mattabad and in Tehran we have contacts with 40 churches, includ-

Ministry Information

The *Progress Report* is a free, bi-monthly publication of the FINAL FRONTIERS FOUNDATION INC., whose purpose is to effectively take the Gospel to the more than three billion souls, who have never before heard. Currently we are ministering in fifty-eight nations. Many of these countries are closed to foreign missionaries, and in others, work among the various tribal groups is restricted to national preachers only, thus they are open to us because of our unique method of missions.

We believe that the training and subsidizing of national preachers is the most efficient and effective method of global evangelism. Thus we seek to raise prayer and financial support from believers in the West, for God's servants abroad, who are actively involved in church planting and discipleship.

Selection of those we sponsor is dependent upon their doctrinal beliefs, need and reputation. We support only those who are serving by faith, never those who are waiting for a salary in order to serve. Worldwide, the average preacher in a third-world country needs as little as \$35.00 - \$100.00 each month to support his family and ministry.

All those subsidized through this foundation are involved in church planting. Their various outreach ministries include: Bible translation and distribution, radio and television broadcasting, camps, Bible schools, outdoor and film evangelism, educational and health programs, handicap and leper ministries, orphan and children's ministries, etc.

Current ministries available for support are:

- Sponsorship of a national or native preacher (\$35.00 monthly)
- Sponsorship of a *TEAM* of preachers in a given country (\$10.00 minimum per month)
- Sponsorship of an orphan through our *CHILD CARE* subsidiary (\$35.00 monthly)
- Membership in the Final Frontiers Society, Bible distribution program (\$10.00 monthly)

FINAL FRONTIERS, a non-profit, religious corporation, was founded by Jon Nelms in 1987, and is governed by those serving on the Executive Board of Directors: Rev. Jon Nelms (Chairman), Rev. At this time we don't need to buy any more but I promise to let you know in the future if the need arises. You cannot imagine how it hurts me to ask people NOT to send money but the need has been abundantly met and we don't want to abuse your generosity.

for us but they have now given a "final rejection", even though her condition is described by the doctors as being life threatening.

Our attorneys state that we should be able to win this if it ever goes to trial and then the insurance company will have to reimburse us; but for now if she is going to have the operation we must pay for it ourselves. Unfortunately the operation will cost up to \$20,000 and I am told that a high percentage of these procedures incur complications that can easily double or triple that amount. I have put this off as long as we can but her condition is now increasingly life threatening and our doctor has insisted that we must act soon. So, I am humbled to ask for your help and at the same time inform you that if you desire, and if the insurance company is forced to reimburse the medical

costs, we can certainly pass that back to you. Please pray for Juanita. Not only is life a daily struggle for her but two weeks ago, she unexpectedly lost her father, who is now with the Lord. She is strong and optimistic but we all want to keep her around and help her get back to normal. I'm sure so many of you understand having experienced the same.

Enough of this doom and gloom; let's move on, thanking God for who He is and what we have in Him!



I am the only son with five sisters. I went to school in a Christian orphanage. By the time I completed High School I already had bad friendships and had spoiled my life living without fear of God. ing those in the suburbs. There are more than 1,100 Believers in our fellowships. Though our pastors, who will lead four to five churches each, generally do have Bibles, for the church members it is rare to own a copy of God's Word. Now however, your gift and sacrifice has remedied that lack and we are able to give a copy to each Believer. There are six churches in the south who have heard that God's Word has come and they have requested that we send them copies, so very soon we will be leaving to make those deliveries. Please pray for us because it is very dangerous transporting the Bibles.

When our journey began in Syria, the first thing we had to do was to find transportation. We had intended to hire a small bus that could hold our four men and forty boxes of Bibles. This was proven to be difficult first of all because unbelieving Muslims did not want to transport Bibles and second because of the fear of entering Iraq where there is still a great deal of fighting and finally because of highwaymen and rebels. You know that many of the rebels and terrorists flow between Iraq and Syria and these are the same roads we would be traveling. At last we were able to find a Toyota van, so we crowded everyone in and made our way to the border.

Crossing from Syria to Iraq was an adventure. The Syrian soldiers at the border allowed us to cross into the neutral area but when we tried to pass the guards on the Iraqi side things became more difficult because of the Kurdish military stationed there. They are always concerned about mysterious shipments coming through that might contain arms or other items for the rebels. These patrols don't allow anyone to pass through their zone with boxes unless they have permission from their local authorities. Last year Final Frontiers had given us \$1,000.00 to buy Bibles for the Kurdish people. Now we

were relying on the Kurdish soldiers to let our shipment for Iran pass through their area.


As it began to look more and more difficult, we decided to try to pass at another area that was being patrolled by the Americans. When we approached them in our vehicle they made us stop and lay down on the ground. They then began to search our bodies and the van for explosives and to question us as to who we were, where we were from, where we were going, etc.

Throughout the entire event, we were treated gently and respectfully. They were at all times both kind and cautious.


Their searching lasted for about 25 minutes because they opened every box to search the contents. When they realized we were transporting New Testaments they were curious as to what kind of Mosque we were from. It was then we were able to tell them we were Christians from the underground churches in Damascus and revealed to them the purpose of our journey. Some of the Iraqi troops were not eager to let us pass and this caught the attention of an American captain standing nearby. He approached with his personal translator and began to question us. We explained that we were Believers

who were taking Bibles to Iran. "Where did the Bibles come from?" he asked. I told him that Christians in American had given us \$16,000.00 to print them and that the Believers in Syria had donated \$4,000.00 to cover the expense of the trip. It

was then he told us that he was a Christian and instructed the guard by his authority to let us pass. As we talked he told us that he too is a Baptist and that he loves to have a part in what we were doing. He said that he had come to Iraqi to liberate

the people from Sadam and that by helping us, he was also now able to liberate their souls.

Under his authority we were released to continue our journey. We had to pass through a dangerous area for the next 45 miles. There were no supplies along that route so before heading out the captain gave us gasoline for our van and food and water. It took us more than an hour and a half to pass this area but we did so without any problems because he provided for us.

Some time later, we came near to the border of Iran. There had been danger involved from the moment we began to pack the van with the New Testaments, but nothing compared to what we were about to experience. Everything to this point, though frowned upon, had been legal. Now we were going to break man's law in obedience to God's law. Several thousand years ago, only a few hundred miles south of where we were, Daniel and his three friends had also chosen to obey God rather than their ruler. Daniel was cast into the den of lions and his three friends were cast into the furnace of fire. In both cases God was with them and delivered them. We prayed and believed that He would deliver us too.

When we approached the border we had to find someone who would rent us his donkeys and transport our boxes over the mountains that reached as high as 20,000 feet. This is a common way of smuggling goods in and out of Iran. No one there ever inquires about what they are being paid to transport, they just hold out their hands for the money. Winter arrives early in this area and it was important that we reached the mountains before the snow began, because when the first flakes fall the mountain trails would be impassable for nine months. Already we were late but God had held back the winter storms for the sake of His children in Iran.

Now that we had arrived at our starting point, we quickly hired four donkeys. It would take five hours for each trip over the mountain and five hours back. Each animal was able to carry five boxes on each trip. Each box contained 300 New Testaments. Thus, each ten hour round trip would deliver 6000 copies of God's Word. They not only had to be delivered, but they had to be hidden while waiting for the second delivery. By the time the trip was over, the donkeys were as exhausted as we were.

I cannot tell you the name of the three men who met us on the other side. I cannot tell you how they know about this trail but it is a common path used by anyone and everyone who smuggles items out of Iran. Everything from Coca Cola to Cocaine; from goods to guns passes along this same trail. As we traveled we would occasionally come upon other smugglers. At this moment you are always terrified because you don't know their cargo or their intention. There are also Iranian troops that patrol this region who will shoot you on sight if you have not paid their bribe. As we walked we prayed. To make our trip safer, we decided to sleep during the day and travel at night. From sundown to sunrise we stumbled along the

mountain trails. Cautiously we would take one step at a time on a rocky path illuminated only by the moon. By God's grace we were as surefooted as the donkeys. By daybreak we were comforted by the warmth of the sun and by the warmth of the greeting of our three Iranian Brothers who were waiting for us. Quickly we unloaded and hid the New Testaments in nearby bushes, then we shared a meal together, sang praises to our loving God and prayed. The Brothers told us of their lives and ministry in Iran and we were thrilled to see how much the Gospel is spreading. Then we settled down for rest and waited for the sun to go down so we could pass back over the mountains. When we got back to the Iraqi side, we slept during the day, then loaded the donkeys with the second shipment and repeated the journey throughout the next night. If any of us had been caught, we would have been executed. That thought accompanied each step we took as did the realization that this life is only an introduction to eternal life. If we were caught we would be killed but if we were killed, we would receive a crown!

After two days we reached Damascus and our families were thrilled to have us return. In a short time we received a call from the pastor who had met us on the Iranian side. He wanted us to know that he arrived safely home as well and that they had already begun to distribute the Bibles. We were amazed to hear how happy and hungry for God's Word the Iranian Brothers were. They were so excited that now each believing family could have their own copy of the Words of God. News of the arrival was spreading rapidly and he told us that he was getting requests from all over Iran from the leaders of house churches who needed Bibles for their congregations.

It was incredible to learn also how the New Testaments were effecting the unbelievers. One young man living nearby the pastor received a copy and began coming to the pastor's house to speak with him. After three weeks of conversation he accepted Christ. Becoming a Believer in Iran is a life and death decision, yet this man, along with thousands of others are turning from Islam to Christianity.

A church member who received a copy is sixty-three years old. She had never learned to read, being a woman living in a strict Islamic nation. She would have her grandson read to her every night and use the New Testament to begin to learn how to read. She testified at her house church that having her own Bible is the greatest thing that has happened in her life since she accepted Christ.

One brother, an elderly man of sixty-eight years received his New Testament from his pastor. As he held it in his hands and opened the cover he began to read. After a moment he could read no more, the tears in his eyes were blurring his sight. He took the pastor's hands and said, "Please tell the brethren in America thank you for giving me this opportunity to see the Bible in my language and read it before I die."

I now want to thank you all for your help and your gift. I am told that the New Testaments cost a total of \$18,000.00 to print. Final Frontiers gave \$16,000.00 and some other Christians in American who heard of our need gave \$2,000.00. Then the churches in Syria gave \$4,000.00 to pay for the shipment, the van, the donkeys, etc. While you were all sacrificing for us, we were eagerly waiting for your gift. I want you to know on behalf of all of us that we are so grateful to you. So many of our people now hold God's Word in their hands for the first time in their lives. This is a dream we have shared for decades. Many of our adults had never even seen a Bible. It has been like a rumor to many of us. A fairy tale that has become reality.

We want you to know that we will not take this great gift for granted. We treasure God's Word and will use them to supply the need of all His children here who are lacking. We will carefully use them to bring more of our countrymen to the Truth of Christ. We will pray for you and offer our praise to God because of you.

Postscript ...

The 2003 UNDP Arab Human Development Report states that the 23 countries comprising the Arab world, which comprise 5% of the world's population (300,000,000 people) are as a region, among the most backward in the world.

- ◆ Their combined gross domestic product is less than that of the country of Spain.
- ◆ 65 million adults are illiterate (including two-thirds of the women)
- ◆ 10 million children do not attend school
- ◆ 15% are unemployed (the highest rate in the world)
- ◆ Only 1.6% have internet access
- ◆ The region has per capita, the world's lowest number of telephones, computers and websites.
- ◆ Each year the nation of Spain alone, translates as many books into Spanish as have been translated into Arabic in the past 1,000 years

Recently I heard a report which stated that in the past ten years, more than 100,000 new Believers have been won to Christ in Iran. All that - and without our knowledge. Truly God's church is advancing all over the Islamic world and He doesn't need our help to do so. It is not *because* of us that they have come to Christ, it is in spite of us. We are privileged to be allowed to have a small part.

Final Frontiers has been involved in reaching the Muslims of this region for more than a decade; long before it became popular, long before the typical American had even heard the name of Sadam Hussein. We thank God for his faithful and devoted servants who have shared with us the opportunity to participate in their harvest fields. We look forward to being able to support even more of them as time goes by. I am eager to hear from any of you who wish to purchase more Bibles, support a preacher in that region or just give to one of the TEAM funds for these countries. (see page 15)


Most of this has come from a handful of donors who share our concern about spreading God's written Word. I hope after reading this story, their numbers will increase dramatically. We must see to it that every person alive in our generation hears the Word and receives a copy of the Word. No man, created in the image of the Living God should be without a copy of His revealed Word. At this moment, millions of Arabs are ripe for salvation but they are not exposed to Christian television, radio, street preaching, crusades, etc. But God's Word, personally and privately placed in their hands, will accomplish what God intends for it to. We must get it to them.

There are 23 nations that speak the Arabic language. Currently we have heart felt requests for:

- ◆ 10,000 Bibles for Syria
- ◆ 2,000 Bibles for Sudan
- ◆ 1,000 Bibles for Morocco
- ◆ 1,000 Bibles for Algeria

An Arabic Bible costs us slightly less than \$2.00 each, *printed and delivered*. If you desire to help with these needs, please send your check and designate it for **Arabic Bibles**. If you would like to cover the current need for a specific country please let us know. Otherwise your funds will be applied to whatever country the team in the Middle East determines.



Q. and A.

Because of the philosophical uniqueness of our ministry, potential sponsors often have some great questions. Here are a sample that might answer some of your questions as well.

Is there a plan to eventually turn the support of these men over to their local churches?

The support we offer is more of a subsidy than a salary. It is not our intent to remove the local church's responsibility to care for their own preachers. However the men we support are church planters which means they typically move on to start another work, once the existing church is capable of supporting a pastor.

How long do we expect that these preachers will need outside support?

As long as the preacher is "actively and consistently involved in church planting and discipleship" he is qualified for continued assistance. Not all of our men are pastors but those who are will lose their support if their ministry ceases to be one of outreach and becomes limited to the four walls of their single congregation. We assist men who are fulfilling the Great Commission in their own ministry.

What is FF doing to help those churches become self sustaining and mission minded?

All the men we support lead their churches as such. Many if not all have their own mission program of supporting outreach in their own country and beyond. It is not uncommon for them to use "faith promise" as well as giving up to 50% of their offerings to missions. Please keep in mind that we work with highly qualified and experienced men. They need no training from us. Most do maintain ongoing training as it is available but we are not working with students or novices. The men we help must already be trained and have had experience in planting churches and able to point to men in the ministry that they trained, in order to meet our basic requirements for support. Beyond that, they must be "actively and consistently involved in church planting and discipleship".

How does FF ensure that the support levels of these preachers are appropriate for their cultures?

It is our desire to assist a preacher so that he can be full time in ministry rather than part time. This is accomplished by our partnership with his church which already provides some type of salary. We never seek to elevate a man above the average means of his community. For that reason we generally offer support of \$25-50 monthly. For example, our typical support in Vietnam is only \$25 since the average income is around \$35 monthly. In India a typical wage is \$2 daily. Most of the preachers we assist are from village churches and receive around 0.25 cents per day. Our support then brings him to nearly an average income level.

What process of accountability is there to evaluate the performance and doctrine of these missionaries?

Besides meeting the basic requirements already listed, the applicant must also meet doctrinal requirements that would qualify him for any Baptist church anywhere in the world. Before he sees our doctrinal statement we see his. Also, in order to give an application, he must be referred to us by a missionary from a fundamental board or a national with whom we have a relationship. That referral must be based on a "long term personal knowledge of the man and his ministry". We have a "one strike-you're out" policy as far as referrals are concerned. In other words, it does not matter how many men one may have referred to us in the past that are acceptable. Once a non-acceptable application is given, that individual loses the right to ever recommend anyone else for support - FOREVER.

Have you seen many of the churches shed their dependence upon outside money?

We are not supporting the churches, we are supporting church planters. Thus this question really is not pertinent to our situation. Many of the groups with which we work are rural or tribal and as such, do not have much money. Their offerings are usually given in the form of rice, eggs, etc. Items which are bartered. All the churches with whom I have had experience teach the doctrine of tithing.

Please explain how sending money rather than missionaries better fulfills our church's mandate to go?

- ◆ More than half of the world is closed to foreign missionaries, yet we still have a command to reach them. If we rely on sending only Americans, we will not reach them.
- ◆ The command is not given to us to only send missionaries who look like us, the command is to send missionaries.
- ◆ They already speak the language, know the culture, can handle the food and climate, there is no deputation, no furlough, no language school, etc.
- ◆ From a stewardship standpoint, you can support 10 to 100 nationals for the cost of one missionary. Stewardship should not be the only consideration but neither should it be ignored.
- ◆ It is estimated that over half the missionaries sent out do not return for a second tour or duty. This means we have wasted "missions money" on deputation, language school, furlough - for men, most of whom did not plant a single church in their first term. In fact, most missionaries will never plant a church in their entire career. Some boards do not even permit church planting.

- ◆ National preachers can be held accountable to one or two individual or church sponsors therefore concentrating the accountability. Sponsors are encouraged to write and visit.
- ◆ Finally, we should understand that just because we do not personally “go” does not mean we are not fulfilling the Great Commission. The “church” is the body of Christ. Whether we are giving money to an American to go, or to a national who is already there, we are still fulfilling that part of Christ’s command.

Are the churches planted ever asked to contribute a little bit to the FF planters for their later projects, so that their need for outside subsidization would diminish over time, and new planters could be recruited to take their places?

Yes, they do. Their funds do not come to our office, they are used in their own land to support their own church planting efforts, purchasing tracts and Bibles, etc. All the men we work with have their own "Timothys" whom we do not support. As I mentioned yesterday, we don't support novices. The churches care for them and Bible college students as well. I have no doubt that there are at least several million preachers serving worldwide without help. We are not attempting to help them all because many, if not the majority, are not church planters. If a preacher ceases to be a church planter, his support also ceases. It should be noted also that the churches make up for the lack of the support we give. Again, ours is a subsidy meant to help them be full time. It is not a full time salary but a subsidy to fill the void of what their church is unable to provide.

Additionally, many of these also send their own foreign missionaries after time. I have seen Latin American missionaries in Spain and the Philippines and India. I have seen Indian missionaries in Nepal and Bangladesh and Myanmar; Pilipino missionaries in Thailand, Cambodia and India, etc. We are not involved in this type of cross cultural work except under certain conditions.

What network exists for these planters to link up with traditional missionaries to obtain materials and share the benefits of partnership? Or are you primarily focusing on fields closed to the West?

Many of these already know missionaries and use their resources. The internet has helped with that a lot as well. Our primary focus is closed fields and limited fields. There are some countries where missionaries are permitted, but they are not allowed to work with the tribal groups. Thailand and Brazil are good examples of that. In others, missionaries are permitted but not under that name. They are restricted to social and educational work and are not allowed to preach, witness or disciple. Some do, but are expelled when caught. Vietnam, Jordon and China are good examples of those. In some countries we work with the nationals through an American missionary. He in fact serves as a "regional or national director" for

us. As such, he recommends whom to support, how much to support and when to drop support. He disperses the funding and gets their reports sent back to us that we send on to the sponsors. Kenya, Honduras and the Philippines are examples of this. In most cases the men who serve in these administrative capacities were referred to us by missionaries. Fiji, Uganda, Togo, Mexico, Russia, Romania and India are some examples of this.

Is FF able to be involved in scripture translation, and if not, how do you obtain and distribute Bibles for the planted churches?

Some of the preachers we have funded are involved in translation. They have been used by other denominations as translators as well. One example is the Akha Bible in northern Thailand. Once the job was completed in the summer of 2002, our preachers rejected it because the American Baptists, who financed the work deleted the blood atonement, etc. They also translate hymns and study materials.

We have a branch ministry called the Final Frontiers Society that raises funding for printing and purchasing of Bibles and tracts. We recently provided 1,000,000 tracts in the Telegu language and several million in Spanish. We also sent 10,000 Bibles to the Kurds and 11,000 New Testaments into Iran. Most nations also have their own Bible printing as a branch of the International Bible Society. We have also sent Bibles to Nicaragua, China, Syria, India, etc.

How much and what kind of reporting are the church planters expected to provide to FF?

They are funded three times annually. With the check goes a report form for each preacher to fill out (one for each sponsor he has). On the top is his name, the sponsor's name, the amount given for him by the sponsor, etc. He is asked to report on the previous 4 month period as to:

- ◆ How many souls were saved
- ◆ How many people baptized
- ◆ Did they evangelize any new unreached areas (villages, barrios, etc.)
- ◆ Did they plant any new churches
- ◆ Do they have any specific prayer requests
- ◆ Did they receive their funding (This shows the sponsor that neither our office nor the national directors siphoned any of their funds for personal use.)
- ◆ Then on the bottom half of the page the preacher is asked to write a letter of thanks to the sponsor.

When we receive these reports, we read and make copies for our files and compile the statistics, then we send the original and any photos that were included, on to the sponsor.

Why we do need Bibles for Syria:

- ◆ The Bible is very infrequently available in Syria. Until now we still circulate the Bible among our believers, because many of them do not have one.
- ◆ To reach Moslems for Christ, you have to let him read the Bible, because most of them never have seen the Bible or read the Bible, and the concept of many of them is that Christ is only a prophet and He came to prepare the world for the final prophet - Mohamed. Without word of God we could not reach Moslems to Christ. The Bible says: "faith cometh by hearing and hearing by the Word of God."
- ◆ Moslems are under the bondage of sin and darkness and demons possession, and nothing will deliver them; only the truth and the truth is the word of God, the truth is Jesus Christ. In John 8:32 it says, "And ye shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you free." That is why we should send it to these Arabic Moslem people.
- ◆ The Arabic Bible had been translated to Arabic language in 1860, from textus receptus by an American missionary in Lebanon.
- ◆ We have permission to print 30,000 Arabic N.T in Syria each one cost about \$1.50.
- ◆ We have the people to distribute the Bibles and teach the Bible. We only lack in the funds to print all that we need. Already our people have paid for the printing of thousands but we need so many more.


